

January marks the beginning of a new year. This month your student has learned about setting SMART goals. A SMART goal is specific, measurable, attainable, relevant, and time-bound. Students have been engaged as they are beginning to set goals that they can accomplish before the end of the school year. In Kindergarten, we have set a class goal to be more kind, and have begun by playing kindness bingo. Grades 1-3



have learned about SMART goals, set a goal, and made a plan to accomplish that goal. While grades 4-6 are working on finding pictures that will represent the SMART goals they have set. Over the next month, these pictures will be compiled to create a vision board for each student. It has been really fun to see students focus on what they would like to accomplish in the next few months. These goals have ranged from becoming a better snowboarder to improving reading comprehension. Ask your student what their SMART goals are!


PROGRAM UPDATES



Last month we talked about our school's Tier 1 curriculum, designed to meet the needs of most students. For students who need a little bit more, we have the RTI process and Tier 2 interventions. RTI stands for "response to intervention."

Interventions can include pre-teaching or reteaching concepts in small groups or 1:1 settings, lessons that are specifically designed based on results of I-Ready testing, and the remediation materials that are part of CKLA and Bridges Math. These resources help teachers to provide students with "just in time" instruction, helping to fill the gaps from related prior grade level concepts, so that students are able to successfully learn at their current grade level. Digital programs that allow students to work at their independent learning level and pace, such as Lexia, Amplify Reading, Zearn, and Imagine Math, are also sometimes used as interventions. These programs provide teachers with additional data about student achievement and trouble areas, along with lessons to help meet individual student needs.

Interventions can happen all day long, but our school master schedule provides 30 minutes each day specifically for both Reading and Math intervention time. This year, we are very excited

that our school has been able to use Literacy funds to provide teacher aides to K-3 classes, who help teachers to provide targeted services for more students. Students who are working at or above grade level also receive differentiated learning activities during that time slot. About every six weeks, grade level teachers meet with the RTI team to review growth monitoring data and determine whether interventions are working, or whether something else needs to be offered. We work together to try to make the most out of intervention minutes, with the goal of helping each student be successful.






