

Who is eligible?

Children are eligible for P-EBT benefits if:

- Their school is closed or has reduced in-person attendance hours.
- They are eligible for free or reduced-price school meals in 2020-2021.

What are Pandemic EBT or P-EBT benefits?

Due to COVID-19, children who are eligible for free or reduced-price school meals in 2020-2021 will get extra food benefits if they attend a qualifying school. These food benefits are called P-EBT. P-EBT benefits help Idaho families buy food when schools are closed or have reduced in-person attendance.

How do families apply?

Great news: Families don't have to apply for the P-EBT Program! If your child is eligible for free or reduced-price school meals, they may automatically qualify. Families should ensure their current mailing address is on file with the child's school and are encouraged to fill out a school meal application for 2020-2021 if their child doesn't get free or reduced-price meals already.

How much will families get?

Benefit amounts vary depending on the predominant learning model of their child's school for each given month. They must be learning virtually or have reduced learning hours for 5 days to qualify. The monthly benefit amount may vary among children.

What does the P-EBT card look like?

Watch the mail for a card that looks like this! The P-EBT card is separate from and doesn't replace a food or cash (Quest) EBT card.



When will P-EBT cards arrive?

Eligible children should expect to receive a notice by late May-mid June, which will contain more information. The P-EBT card will be mailed separately in the following weeks.

How are P-EBT cards used?

P-EBT cards can be used like a debit card to buy food in most grocery stores and farmers markets, or to buy food online at Amazon or Walmart.

Will families get a new P-EBT card each month?

No, families should keep each child's new P-EBT card. Additional benefits may need to be issued to the card for as long as the COVID-19 public health emergency continues.
